

#### ABOUT WESLEYAN UNIVERSITY

Wesleyan is a small, private, non-sectarian university of liberal arts and sciences for men and women in Middletown, Connecticut. Established in 1831, it was the first school in the U.S. to be named in honor of John Wesley, the founder of Methodism.

Wesleyan provides academic opportunities and facilities usually found only at larger universities. Wesleyan is among the most selective institutions in the country. About 78 percent of its students were in the top tenth of their secondary school classes. Median SAT scores for the class of 2009 are 720 Verbal, 710 Math and 720 Writing. Although Wesleyan is academically demanding, its atmosphere is welcoming and non-competitive.

Of approximately 2,750 undergraduates, about 47 percent are male and 53 percent female. Wesleyan has a full-time graduate enrollment of about 150 in the sciences, mathematics and ethnomusicology. Because of the University's relatively small size, students readily find their niche in the classroom and the community.

Wesleyan's most important resource is its faculty. The approximately 350 faculty all teach undergraduates, the vast majority in full-time instruction. The student-faculty ratio is approximately 9:1. Wesleyan's faculty includes a Pulitzer Prize winner, a MacArthur ("genius grant") Fellow and numerous recipients of Rockefeller, Guggenheim and other national prizes for teaching and research. About one-third are women and nearly 15 percent are persons of color.

Student-sponsored activities form the core of Wesleyan's social life. The more than 125 student organizations at Wesleyan cover a range of interests: martial arts, outdoor activities, community tutoring, a cappella singing, literary magazines, theater and dance troupes, WESU-radio, political organizations and ethnic interest and support groups of all stripes. New groups are being formed constantly in response to student interest.

Athletics, both at the varsity, intramural and club level, are popular and well-supported by the 16-year old Freeman Athletic Center which recently underwent a \$13 million expansion. Wesleyan participates in NCAA Division III sports and is a founding member of the New England Small College Athletic Conference (NESCAC). Varsity teams include baseball, basketball, crew, cross-country, field hockey, football (men), golf, ice hockey, indoor track, lacrosse, soccer, softball, squash, swimming, tennis, track and field, volleyball (women) and wrestling. Intercollegiate club sports include cycling (men and women), equestrian (women), rugby (men and women), sailing (men and women), skiing (men and women), ping-pong, ultimate Frisbee (men and women), volleyball (men) and water polo (men and women); as well as a variety of intramural sports.

#### Wesleyan University Men's Lacrosse 2006 Season Preview

Stepping in to fill the leadership shoes of the class of 2005 will be a talented and dedicated group of tri-captains. Glenn Adams '06, Bob Diehl '06 and Jordan Funt '06 will be the guiding force of the team this year. The captains along with all of our seniors will have a lot of guidance to give with 17 freshmen on this year's team. It is the biggest recruiting class in team history.

Defense has always been the backbone of our team. This year we must replace All-American Paul Malangone '05, who was a three-year defensive starter, and Phil Amidon '05, who was a two-year starter. The Cardinals must replace goalie Matt Wheeler '05, who was a tremendous senior captain and three-year starter for the Cardinals. All of these players helped lead a cohesive unit for the past couple of years and will be sorely missed. This season the defense will be different in the sense that there will be a number of players trying to fill the role of the graduated players. I feel we are very deep and have a number of guys who can step up to the challenge. Look for Matt Smith '06, who earned a starting spot last year to be a prime-time player this season. He is big and fast and his aggressive play causes a lot of problems for opponents. Tom Bendon '07, Matt Burke '07, Bob Diehl '06 and Zach Librizzi '08 will be looked upon to increase their roles on the defensive end of the field. All four have a lot of experience and are very talented. They all should help Wesleyan to be one of the top defenses in the conference. Peter Harris '07 is returning for his third year as a long-pole midfielder. He is a very big, physical defender who has a lot of speed, and very good take-away skills. He is a strong candidate for All-American if he can stay healthy. The defensive midfield position returns intact. Nate Byer '07 and Jeff McLaren '06 are both very physical athletic players. Byer is a multi-talented player who will be an offensive threat, too. He has a very hard shot and can dominate on faceoffs as well. McLaren, who is also a two-time football captain, will be one of the top D-mids in the country. He is extremely fast and is almost impossible to beat one-on-one. Bobby Goulding '08 played a lot last year and his role is expected to increase and add depth to the midfield continue position. Goulding is also a very good face-off man.

Offensively the Cardinals are looking great from both the attack and midfield positions. Glenn Adams is back after a tremendous junior year, earning All-America honors for the second consecutive year. Adams is a candidate for NESCAC Player of the Year and National Midfielder of the Year. He is very quick and has a great shot on the run. Joining Adams will be Mike Hines '07 who had a great sophomore year and is capable of being an All-American this season. Hines is a great shooter and his speed and strength make him a tremendous threat for the Cardinals. Mike Vitulano '06 is always a threat around the cage and is one of the most feared crease players in Division III lacrosse. All three started together last year and work very well with each other. Both Chris Jasinski '08 and Alex Kaufman '08, who were high-school All Americans, made a huge impact on our program in 2005. They have outstanding speed and skills and will be a major threat every time the step on the field. Look for Steve Binswanger '06 and some very talented freshmen to make an impact on offense as well this year. They will give the Cardinals some extra firepower on the field.

The attack unit lost two tremendous players in Chris Knacke '05 and Chris Meade '05. They both scored over 100 career points and were a major part of the Cardinal offense for the past couple of years. The Cardinals do return Jordan Funt '06 who had a great junior year and really shined in the playoffs. He was one of the most productive players on the team when we need it most. Funt is a three-year starter and is a great candidate for post-season honors. Both Grayson Connors '08 and Mike Walsh '06 can shoot extremely well and are experienced players. Connors is a deadly shooter who will make a great impact on this year's team. Walsh also has a cannon of a shot. He has been a man-up specialist and always seems to score at the right time. Jesse Bardo '07 played attack last season but could also play some midfield at times. He is a very hard worker and is looking to find his role this season. There are some stars in the making on attack who will help give an offensive boost to the Cardinals right away.

At the opposite end of the field, the goalie situation is extremely bright. Charlie Congleton '07 was one of the top goalies in the conference last year and has an opportunity to be an All-American this season. Whit Harrison '06 should provide great back-up support. Two promising frosh should push the upper classmen for playing time.

#### Wesleyan University Lacrosse Fields



North Field (left) .... has been the home field for Wesleyan lacrosse for about 25 years. Surrounded by the University's art center, the Reid House, which houses the admissions office, and shortly across the street from the new Usdan University Center, North Field provides a wonderful venue for watching Wesleyan athletes in action. The field also is home to Wesleyan women's lacrosse and men's and women's soccer in the fall.

Wesleyan began construction of an artificial turf field (right) in the fall of 2005, located on the Long Lane property south of the Freeman Athletic Center. It will be officially dedicated during a ceremony on Saturday, April 29, 2006. The field will service men's and women's lacrosse for inclement weather practice and games as well as men's and women's soccer. It will be the primary playing field for Wesleyan's field hockey squad during the fall.

### Wesleyan University Men's Lacrosse 2006 Coaching Staff

#### John Raba - Head Coach



Coming aboard the full-time Wesleyan staff in 1996 and now an adjunct associate professor in the physical education department, John Raba enters his 10th season as head coach of men's lacrosse during 2006. John has a 96-51 record at Wesleyan, including a 17-3 mark in 2001, the best season ever at the college. For this accomplishment, John was named both NESCAC and NEILA Division III Coach of the Year. He was named co-Coach of the Year by the NEILA in 2005 after his squad posted a 13-6 overall mark, reached the NESCAC finals and received its firstever bid to the NCAA Division III tournament, making it to the quarter-finals. Both his 2000 and 2001 squads reached the ECAC New England Division III title game. After posting a 14-4 mark and reaching the NESCAC Championship game in 2004, John also received NEILA Coach of the Year laurels. His 2005 squad captured its third straight Little Three title and has won four outright crowns and shared two others over the last six years, all

of them winning seasons. John serves on the USILA All-American Committee and is a regional representative on the NCAA men's lacrosse advisory selection committee. In addition to coaching lacrosse, John has assisted with the football team during the fall working on the defensive side of the ball each of his nine seasons while acting as defensive coordinator for the last seven years.


A 1993 graduate of the University of New Haven, John was an All-American lacrosse player for the Chargers and led Division II in scoring in 1992. Also outstanding on the gridiron, John was a team captain, a two-time all-New England pick as a fullback and earned team MVP honors as well. John was honored by U.N.H. as its male athlete of the year in both 1991-92 and 1992-93.

Before coming to Wesleyan in 1996, John picked up lacrosse coaching experience as an assistant at New Haven (1993), Quinnipiac (1994) and with the New Haven Silver Bullets men's club team (1993-95). He also served as an assistant football coach at Brown during the 1995 season. John is a Long Island native and attended lacrosse powerhouse Farmingdale High School, graduating in 1989.

#### Will Parker - Assistant Coach



Will Parker will be in his eighth season as a part-time staffer and has coached both boys and girls high-school lacrosse in Connecticut prior to his work at Wesleyan. He also was an assistant coach at his alma mater, Quinnipiac College, in 1998. A 1996 grad, Will earned all-league honors on defense for the Braves as a senior and was an all-New England choice at New Haven in 1994 before transferring to Quinnipiac. A veteran clinician as well, Will is a special education computer instructor at Foundation High School in Milford and is pursuing a master's degree at Southern Conn. Will was an assistant coach during the NEISL East-West senior all-star game in June, 2005.

#### Rick McCarthy - Assistant Coach



Most recently the head coach of the men's lacrosse team at Western Connecticut State U. for the 2004 and 2005 seasons, Rick McCarthy returns to Wesleyan as an assistant coach after serving in that capacity during the 2003 campaign. Prior to that, Rick had been head coach of Eastern Connecticut State University's highly successful men's lacrosse team from its inception as a varsity team in 1996 through the 2002 season. In his seven seasons ECSU, Rick posted a lofty 91-19 record and was a three-time conference coach of the year. He led the Warriors to post season berths each of his last four seasons, including two ECAC New England Division III playoff berths in 1999 and 2000 and two straight NCAA Division III tournament at-large qualifications as champions of the Little East conference in 2001 and 2002.

Rick began his lacrosse coaching career at Babson College in 1975. There he compiled a 34-13 mark in four years and

took the Beavers to an NCAA Division II tournament appearance in 1979. He has been involved in coaching for 37 years since his graduation from Yale University in 1968, handling mostly lacrosse and ice hockey, but also basketball and football at various levels of activity throughout southern New England.

Rick also served as co-coach of the North squad at the 2002 STX/USILA North-South Division III senior all-star game and had coached in the New England Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (NEILA) East-West senior all-star game in 1996. He is a past-president of the NEILA (2002-03) and has been a member of the Division III men's lacrosse national poll committee, the weekly NEILA rating board, the ECAC Division III men's lacrosse advisory board and the USILA All-America advisory board.

Rick established the varsity team at WCSU in 2004, going 3-8 his first year and improving to 11-5 in 2005, good enough for a spot in the ECAC New England Division III tournament. Rick also has international coaching experience, having twice coached Connecticut-based teams during tournaments in Australia.

Retiring from service to the State of Connecticut this past summer, Rick continues as a consultant to the admissions offices at both Eastern Connecticut and Mitchell College.

#### **Chris Howes - Assistant Coach**



Chris Howes joined the men's lacrosse coaching staff as a newcomer in 2005 and will be in his second year in 2006. He spent five years (2000-2004) building the boy's lacrosse program at Rocky Hill School in East Greenwich, R.I., taking the team from a 1-15 record in 2000 to two consecutive league titles (2003, 2004) and an undefeated season in 2004. A 1998 graduate of Bates College where he captained the lacrosse team as a senior, Chris spent his first year out of college helping to start the lacrosse program at Mitchell College in New London, Conn. Chris is enrolled in Wesleyan's MALS program and serves an an intern in the admissions office at the University. Chris was an assistant coach during the NEISL East-West senior all-star game in June, 2005.

#### Meet the 2006 Wesleyan University Men's Lacrosse Tri-Captains








Tri-captains Glenn Adams '06 (#13), Bob Diehl '06 (#10) and Jordan Funt '06 (#36) are part of an outstanding group of seniors who have helped shape the fortunes of Wesleyan men's lacrosse over the last four years. Coming into the 2006 campaign, these three four-year players have been part of Cardinal squads that have collectively compiled a record of 38-15, qualified for three NESCAC tournaments with two appearances in the champonship game and a first-ever bid to the NCAA Division III tournament in 2005.

No talk of Wesleyan men's lacrosse over the last four years can begin without citing the accomplishments of Glenn Adams. Bursting on the scene as an offensive midfielder during the 2003 season, Glenn picked up 19 goals and 19 assists to finish third on the team in scoring with 38 points. He was named NESCAC Rookie of the Year as well as a second-team all-NESCAC choice. In 2004, Glenn added to his point total by leading the team with 26 goals and 25 assists for 51 points while receiving first-team all-NESCAC, all-New England Division III and ECAC New England Division III honors. He also found a spot on the USILA's Division III honorable-mention All-America list. His 2005 performance included a team-high 49 points on 20 goals and 29 assists, a first-team all-NESCAC and New England Division III accolade and a well-deserved position as a second-team Division III All-American by the USILA. His 138 career points coming into 2006 ranks fifth all-time at the University.

Bob Diehl has been biding his time as a situational defender most of his career, seeing action in all but two games the last two years as a crease defender during mandown situations while also spending quite a bit of time in a reserve role on defense. He is expected to fit in as a starter on defense for 2006.

A consistent force on attack for the Cardinals the last three seasons, Jordan Funt has been on a steady climb since his freshman year when he ranked sixth on the team in scoring with 14 goals and five assists for 19 points. Since then, Jordan moved up to fifth with 19 goals and 16 assists for 35 points in 2004 and fourth with 19 goals and 19 assists for 38 points a year ago. He is likely to become the Cardinals' 20th career 100-point scorer as he enters 2006 with 92 points.







#### Bill Belichick '75
